Our Water Heritage - Ours to Protect

Manitoba has been blessed with seemingly abundant water resources. Compared to many parts of the world, this is very true. But there are serious threats to this heritage, including pollution, eutrophication, gas fracking, virtual water exports, disputes over private delivery of water, and pressure to commercially export water to the US South West. Maude Barlow will discuss these threats set against the backdrop of the global water crisis and lay out a path to a water secure future for all Manitobans.

Meet Maude Barlow

Maude Barlow is the National Chairperson of the Council of Canadians and chairs the board of Washingtonbased Food and Water Watch. She is also an executive member of the San Francisco-based International Forum on Globalization and a Councillor with the Hamburg-based World Future Council.

Maude is the recipient of ten honorary doctorates and many awards, including the 2005 Right Livelihood Award (known as the "Alternative Nobel"), the Citation of Lifetime Achievement at the 2008 Canadian Environment Award, and the 2009 Earth Day Canada Outstanding Environmental Achievement Award.

In 2008/2009, she served as Senior Advisor on Water to the 63rd President of the United Nations General Assembly. She is also the best-selling author or co-author of 16 books, including the international best seller Blue Covenant: The Global Water Crisis & The Coming Battle for the Right to
